

What to do...

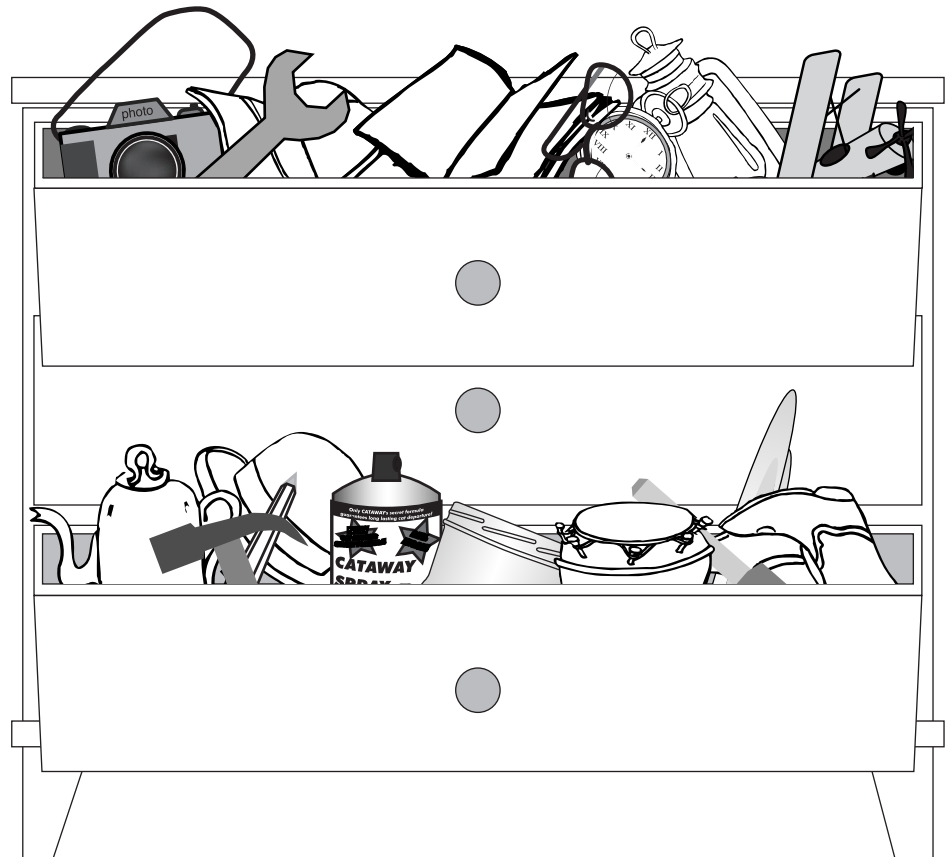
Think of somewhere in your house that is really disorganised, like under your bed or one of the cupboards!

1. Write down ten or more things found in this disorganised place (ask permission before you start rummaging through, or just make up some things that you think MIGHT be in there).
2. Help to sort it out by writing the list of things out again in alphabetical order. Use the alphabet below to help you.
3. Bring the list into school – then, after that, you may want to stick it near the disorganised space!

This activity gives your child some more practice creating alphabetically ordered lists. Your child may need support in trickier areas, such as when two words starting with the same letter are in the list. Which comes first, elastic bands or egg boxes?
